
Suggested Reading For Optional Credit Units

It generally takes at least 2 years of debate club participation to gather optional unit credits through supplemental reading, student written feedback, and unit specific cumulative research time. Please see Mrs. Arp for more details or if you have questions.

For tracking unit credits, our club uses the Basic Skills assessment of 108 sixty minute hours = 1 credit; 54 sixty minute hours = $\frac{1}{2}$ credit.

Balance how many books read vs. unit specific research time. Track how long it took you to read the book and then respond either by test or essay if you are reading the short pamphlets as single items.

Reading more means less time tracking needed from research alone. Suggested books add depth and breadth for debate skills and are strongly recommended for both debate and unit thread understanding.
